

A MEDITATION ON HUMAN RIGHTS AND A WOMAN'S LIFE

Exhibition History

Immediately following the Congressional election in November 1990, fifty leaders around the world received by certified mail or by hand delivery *A MEDITATION ON HUMAN RIGHTS AND A WOMAN'S LIFE* by artist T. Ellen Sollod. Work commenced on this book in August, 1989, shortly after the Supreme Court's Webster decision. It grew out of the artist's conviction that it was a way to speak directly to people who were in a position to influence public policy. Targeted recipients were on both sides of the issue and represented a broad cultural spectrum. The artist believed that personal contact was the key and arranged for hand deliveries of more than two-thirds of the books. Nearly a third of the recipients responded.

In addition to reaching these individuals, the book has reached countless others through exhibitions around the country and public collections. It continues to be exhibited today and used by artist book collections for educational purposes. To date, it has been exhibited in the following locations:
